You must have fire, drive, and ambition to achieve, and hopefully exceed, fundraising targets.

With a 'people first' attitude, building and maintaining valued relationships will be at the heart of your role. You'll be ready to make friends along the way, and eager to work with existing volunteer supporters who share your passion for our cause. Your efforts will be focused on delivering and sustaining excellent stewardship, sensitive to the fact that many of our fundraisers have been impacted by a brain tumour diagnosis and have a visceral connection to the charity.

There is an opportunity to galvanise and grow our volunteer network around our community fundraising, including increasing engagement with our existing community fundraising campaigns. You will work closely with our communications team to promote events and activities, raising awareness of fundraising at *brainstrust*. We encourage new ideas and are always open to building on existing fundraising initiatives.

You will be responsible for overseeing fundraising admin and maintaining the accuracy of our supporter database, adhering to the Fundraising Code of Practice at all times.

Whilst the main areas of focus will be community volunteer fundraising, you will be aware that this work will sometimes cross over into corporate fundraising, family funds, in memory giving, legacy appeals and regular giving. You will be able to demonstrate an interest in marketing, and an understanding of the importance of social media planning and storytelling, all of which are a crucial part of this role.

You will be joining a passionate and ambitious organisation, and will be supported by the Senior Fundraising Officer, Fundraising and Communications Assistant, Communications Manager and the wider team in delivering fundraising initiatives and spreading awareness in the community.
